1. Preliminary tests in General Music Theory (GMT) and Aural Skills

3. Preliminary test in Practical Harmony

- ONLY MANDATORY FOR BACHELOR PIANO CANDIDATES!
- The test evaluates harmonic understanding based on the performed repertoire.
- An additional test for Practical Harmony will also be conducted.

4. Preliminary test in Keyboard Practice

- ONLY MANDATORY FOR MASTER PIANO CANDIDATES!
- This test determines if the candidate possesses the necessary basic skills for the Keyboard Practice course.
- The test includes a prepared section and on-the-spot assessments.

- The unprepared section assesses ear training, harmonic understanding and sight-reading.

5. Practical Entrance Exam for the main discipline

- The jury may choose to have the candidate perform only part of the proposed program.
- The Royal Conservatory Antwerp does not provide a pianist accompanist for the entrance exam. The applicant is
 expected to arrange one if necessary.

BACHELOR

Piano

- Bachelor 1 (at least half of the proposed program must be played by memory):
 - o Prelude and Fugue from "Das wohltemperierte Klavier" by J.S. Bach or a polyphonic work at a similar level.
 - o One movement from a classical sonata by Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, etc.
 - o An etude by Czerny (Op. 636 or 699), Chopin, Moszkowski, Scriabin, Rachmaninov, Liszt, Cramer, etc.
 - o A performance piece from a different style period (not an etude).

The jury will make a selection out of the proposed repertoire during the entrance exam.

- Bachelor 2 & 3: Minimum 30 minutes, fully played by memory, consisting of:
 - o A polyphonic work (Bach or a more recent composer).
 - o A relevant etude (Chopin/Liszt/Skrjabin, etc.).
 - o A classical sonata in its entirety (Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert).
 - o A romantic work of choice (not an etude!).

The jury will make a selection out of the proposed repertoire during the entrance exam.

Accordion

Bachelor 1:

- o Knowledge of scales.
- o A piece combining/alternating seconds and thirds.
- A polyphonic work.
- A cyclic work.
- o A performance piece of choice (memorized).

Bachelor 2:

- o Scales up to 7# / 7b (both M2 and M3): Contrary motion, Thirds, Sixths, Bellow Shakes.
- o Prelude and Fugue from "Das wohltemperierte Klavier" by J.S. Bach.
- o A sonata by A. Scarlatti.
- A composition by W.A. Solotariev (free choice).
- A composition by V. Semionov (free choice).

• Bachelor 3:

- o Scales up to 7# / 7b (both M2 and M3): Contrary motion, Thirds, Sixths, Bellow Shakes.
- o Prelude and Fugue from "Das wohltemperierte Klavier" by J.S. Bach.
- o A sonata by A. Scarlatti.
- Composition by W.A. Solotariev: choice from Ispaniada, Sonata 2, or Children's Suite No. 6.
- o Composition by V. Semionov: choice from Estonian Rhapsody, Don Rhapsody, and Caprice No. 1.

Harpsichord

Bachelor 1:

- o 20-minute program
- demonstrating musical and technical qualities with representative works from three different style periods.
- Bachelor 2 & 3: Mixed recital of at least 35 minutes, including:
 - A major work by J.S. Bach: English suite, partita, French Overture, or Italian Concerto (no prelude & fugue).
 - o A French suite after L. Couperin.
 - o A gallant sonata or a Sturm-und-Drang sonata.

Organ

- Available organs:
 - Collon organ in the conservatory (mechanical, II/ped, Go en POS in French classical style, pedll 16 8 4 + tr 8 cl 4, 1978)

Bachelor 1:

 - Two works by Bach (to be chosen from J.S. Bach: Free Style; J.S. Bach: Chorale Style; J.S. Bach: Trio Play).
 - A selection of works from:

MASTER

Piano - Solo Option

 - o A classical sonata in its entirety (Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert).
 - o A romantic work of choice.

The jury will make a selection out of the proposed repertoire during the entrance exam.

• ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT FOR CONCERT SOLOIST FOCUS: The candidate must send, at the latest, the day before the piano entrance exam, a detailed CV along with evidence of competition participations and results to Stephanie Proot, chair of the Keyboard Department, via stephanie.proot@ap.be.

Piano - Educational Master Option

 - O A polyphonic work (Bach or a more recent composer).
 - A relevant etude (Chopin/Liszt/Skrjabin, etc.).
 - o A classical sonata in its entirety (Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert).
 - A romantic work of choice.

The jury will make a selection out of the proposed repertoire during the entrance exam.

Piano - Chamber Music & Accompaniment Option

 - o A gallant sonata or a Sturm-und-Drang sonata.

PG Organ

- Available organs:
