'Wings' proposes a dance form that transcends the boundaries of the human, delving deeper into the inner workings of the body. The dancer wears a machine created by LWT3, enabling the exploration of bodily sensations such as heartbeat and muscle tension in real-time, serving as dramaturgical and choreographic tools in the creative process.
